

4th Quarter leak dectection and repair program

One of the main components of water conservation is detecting and repairing leaks. The old or poorly constructed pipelines from years ago, inadequate corrosion protection, poorly maintained valves and mechanical damage are some of the factors contributing to leakage. Leak detection has historically assumed that all, if not most, leaks rise to the surface and are visible. In fact, many leaks continue below the surface for long periods of time and remain undetected.

With LARC's aggressive leak-detection program, we can search for and reduce previously undetected leaks in our water system. Just for this quarter, LARC was able to carry out seven (7) major leakage repairs around its service areas. These varies with from leak repair of 4" to 10" PVC mainline.



This accurate location and repair of leaking water pipes in the supply system greatly reduces these losses. Once a leak is detected, corrective actions to minimize water losses in the water distribution system is taken. LARC also makes sure that inspecting pipes, cleaning, lining and other maintenance efforts are being executed to improve the distribution system and prevent leaks and ruptures from occurring. In addition to this, LARC also considers methods for minimizing water used in routine water system maintenance.

Resiliency in times of uncertainty


